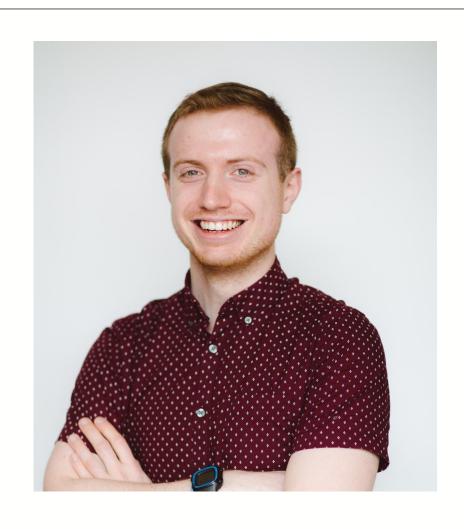

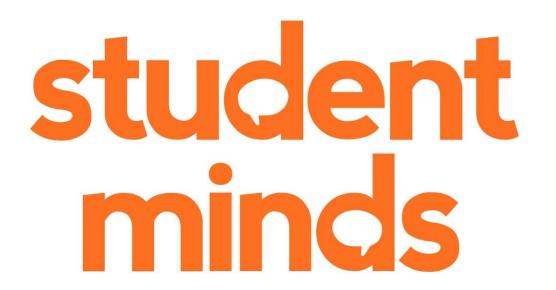
Student Mental Health – UK Context

- UUK 2017 Stepchange Strategic Framework to address student mental health
- 94% of University Student Wellbeing Services reported spiralling numbers of students accessing their services
- More than 50% of students say their mental health declined in 2020 (NUS)
- More students presenting with multiple and complex issues

The Role of Accommodation



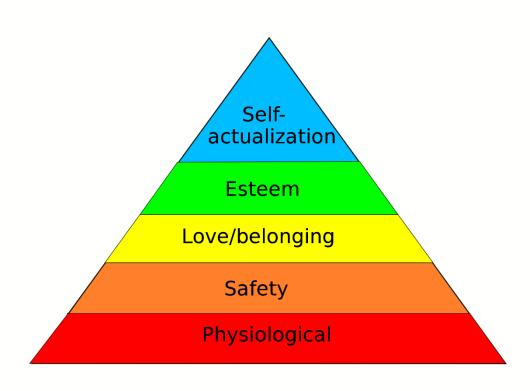


"We provide accommodation – why are we discussing student community wellbeing?"

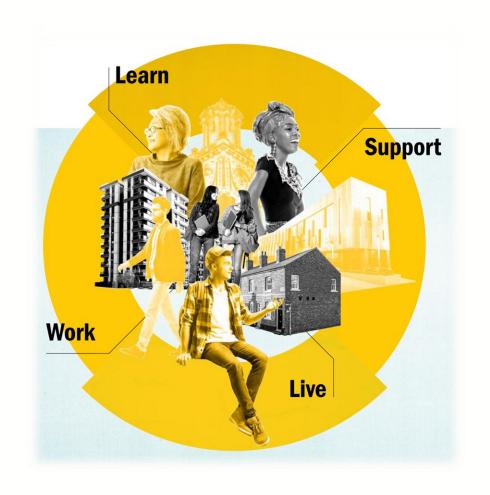

26 Halls of Residences (7 operated by private partners)

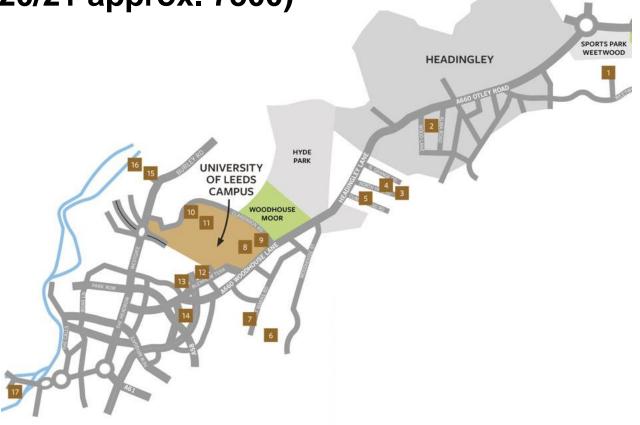

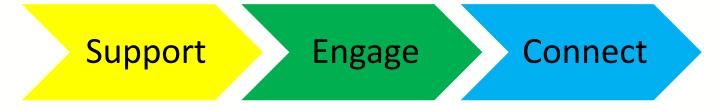


Residence Life at Leeds – Past and Present

- Joined provision and services together to unify halls student experience

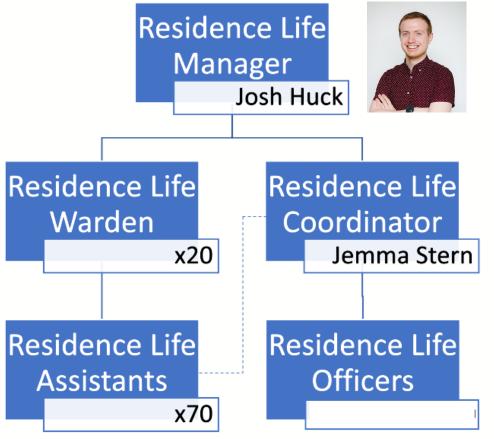
- Three key elements:

Support



- Available 24/7/365
 - Peer support
 - Staff support
 - Senior management support
- Links with University support services
- Assist with the smallest to largest issues
- COVID-19 and supporting self-isolators



Support for those with additional support needs

Residence Life Assistants (RLAs)



- 70 across 18 Residences
- Supervised by a Residence Life Warden
- Current students (Undergraduate or Postgraduate)
- Voluntary Workers; receive free rent
- Work 1 in 4 nights during term time
 - 6pm to 8am weekdays
 - 8am to 8am weekends/Uni closed days
- Undergo extensive week of training



RLA Responsibilities



- Be an active part of the residence community
- Support student welfare and manage discipline
- General student queries
- Minor mental health concerns
- Initial treatment of minor injuries/illness
- Flat disputes
- Dealing with noise complaint & parties



Residence Life Wardens (RLWs)



 RLW role is performed in addition to a substantive role at the University

- Two types
 - Residential
 - Non-Residential
- Receive an honorarium
- Cover all sites where we have allocated students (Private and University sites)
- Work during UG term-time only (excluding PG sites)



RLWs Responsibilities



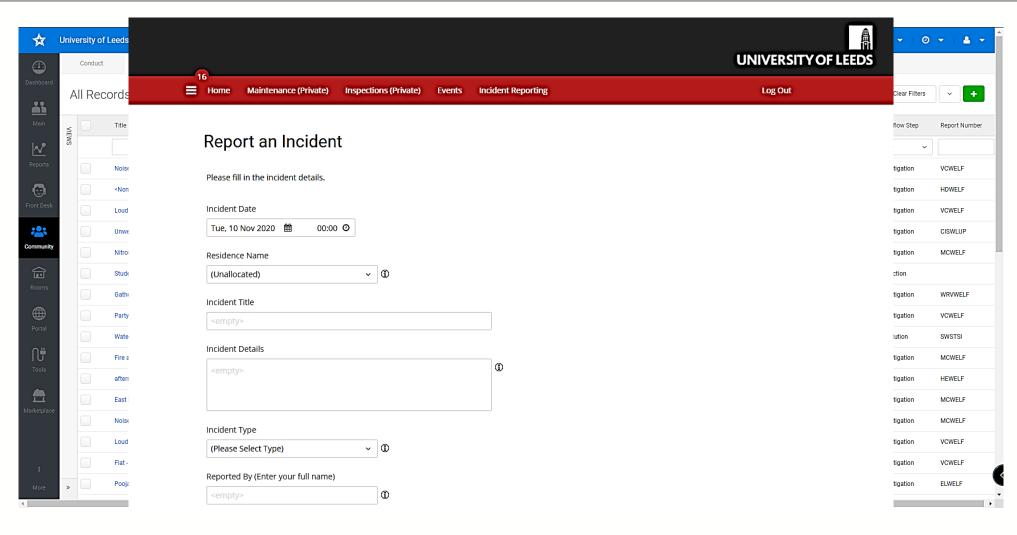
- Manage a team of Residence Life Assistants
- Support students with minor and complex mental health concerns
- Provides staff support out-of-hours with critical incidents
- Manage 'minor' disciplinary issues
- Support the student 'Hall Exec' in running social opportunities

- Induction and transition from home to halls Making Leeds Home
- Community living agreement
- Welcome talks
- Peer support
- Ongoing social events and activities

- Exclusive programme for students in halls
- Five programme themes
 - Social

- Staff and student led events
- Big night in boxes

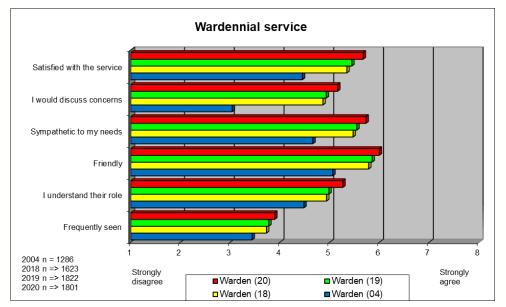


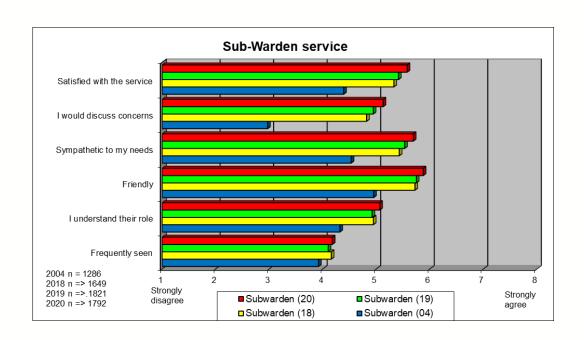
Feedback

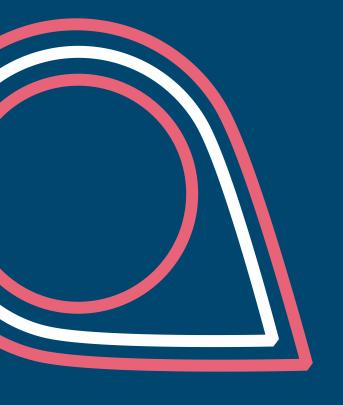
